Dress Code Policy

Ratification by Full Governing Body: October 2014

It has always been the policy of the Honorary Principal, Head Teacher and Governing Body of the School that the highest standards of Jewish practice should be maintained. The Orthodox Jewish Ethos of our School is central to its existence and is dependent not only on our teaching of Jewish Knowledge but also on the way we behave as Jews within the school community, modelling behaviour to the children in our care.

This ethos finds expression not only in what we do but also in how we dress. The school's dress code applies equally to parents, teachers, employees and volunteers who enter the school grounds or participate in a school event elsewhere.

All male Jewish visitors to our school must cover their heads when entering our school site. This includes attendance at any assembly or parents meeting or when collecting children from the playground.

At all assemblies other school events taking place within the school we ask that ladies wear skirts of a modest length. Tops should not be, low cut or show a midriff and sleeves should cover the upper arm. The wearing of leggings does not negate the requirement for skirts be of a modest length.

When entering the school for parents meeting or when collecting children from the playground we ask that ladies tops should not be, low cut or show a midriff and sleeves should cover the upper arm. The wearing of leggings does not negate the requirement for skirts to be of a modest length.

The School reserves the right to ask any visitor or parent who does not dress in accordance to the School's Dress Code to leave the premises or we may refuse entry at the gate.
